The Canyon 271 comes packed with amenities to make your fishing trips easier and more successful. For instance, the rigging station includes a cutting board, bait locker and recessed freshwater shower for easy cleanup. The 42-gallon livewell in the lean bar, plus a second 32-gallon transom well, hold plenty of live pilchards for a full day of fishing. Once you score, use the standard port side door to pull a big fish aboard. To keep your catch fresh, there's a 198-quart insulated fish box in the center of the transom and 85-quart insulated forward fish box for holding plenty of ice and fish. For beverages and food, the front console seating conceals a 67-quart cooler.

The twin 300 hp Yamaha

outboard-powered Canyon 271 achieves an exhilarating top speed of more than 56 mph. Just as importantly, the integrated electric steering results in easy handling. Standard trim tabs with an indicator on the control pad help keep your 271 perfectly trimmed and on an even keel while underway.

For even easier handling, order the optional Yamaha Helm Master EX with Full Maneuverability package that includes joystick, autopilot, and other features.

In addition, think about the optional SureShade electrical retractable cockpit shade, especially if you plan on family cruises or hanging out at the sandbar, an activity for which the standard anchor and windlass will also come in handy.
