GRADY-WHITE FREEDOM 415

When you want to fish in comfort and pampered luxury, Grady-White's new Freedom 415 is the gold standard. Did we mention the air-conditioned helm, the standard Seakeeper 6 gyro stabilizer, and the cockpit wet bar with Dekton sintered stone countertops? Plus a cozy cabin with a 24-inch flat-screen TV?

Here is what's reckoned to be the largest outboard-powered dual console ever built. It borrows much of its angling DNA from Grady-White's benchmark Canyon 456 bluewater center console with its smooth-riding SeaV2 hull design. Only here,

however, you get the benefit of a fully protected, hard-topped enclosure with wraparound windows and a comfy dinette.

Fishing features include twin livewells, 22-foot outriggers, four rocket launchers, and endless rod holders all around the cockpit. For family fun, there's a huge bow seating area with an easy walk-through from the helm, and a pair of mirror-varnished tables. It's speedy too: with its quartet of Yamaha XTO Offshore 450 V8s, you'll reach top speeds of 60 mph ... or relax and cruise at 30 mph. (gradywhite.com)
